

## Michigan Supreme Court Learning Center Docent (Tour Guide)

### Description

Would you like to help people of all ages learn about our government and how courts work? The Michigan Supreme Court Learning Center – a hands-on gallery space inside the Hall of Justice, Lansing – is seeking volunteers to act as docents (tour guides) for school groups and other Learning Center visitors. Tours last one hour and are scheduled during Learning Center hours, Monday–Friday, 9 a.m.–4 p.m.

### Requirements

Learning Center volunteers love the law and have an enthusiasm for informing others. A background in education, law, or government is helpful but not required. Docents must be able to:

- Speak confidently in public.
- Lead groups of children and adults.
- Volunteer 8 hours per month.

Interviews, background checks, and a five-session orientation course are required for new volunteers.

### Orientation

A five-session orientation will be held **Wednesdays, 9 a.m.–12 noon, February 22–March 21, 2012**, at the Michigan Hall of Justice, 925 W. Ottawa St., Lansing.

During orientation sessions, new volunteers will learn about the role of the judicial branch of government and presentation techniques. Continuing education opportunities are also provided.
