

The Michigan Supreme Court is looking for qualified applicants seeking appointment to the Attorney Discipline Board (ADB). <u>Please note that is a volunteer, unpaid position.</u>

The ADB is the adjudicative arm of the Michigan Supreme Court with a constitutional responsibility to supervise and, when necessary, discipline Michigan attorneys. To learn more about the ADB, visit its <u>website</u>. Questions about serving on the ADB should be directed to the ADB.

The ADB consists of three laypersons and six lawyers appointed by the Michigan Supreme Court. Members typically serve a three-year term, though a shorter term may be used if there is an early vacancy. Members may not serve more than two full terms.

This year, there is one layperson vacancy. The new member's term will begin October 1, 2023, and expire September 30, 2026. For information on the powers and duties of the ADB members, see MCR 9.110(E).

## MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

**ATTORNEY MEMBER EDUCATION:** Juris Doctor (JD) from an accredited law school and a member of the State Bar of Michigan.

**LAYPERSON MEMBER EDUCATION:** No minimum requirement.
