MCL 600.947a, requires Military Spouse attorneys to provide written notice to the Board of Law Examiners within 30 days if any of the following occurs:

- 1. My spouse is no longer an individual who is on active duty in the armed forces of the United States.
- 2. I am no longer married to the active service member.
- 3. My spouse received a permanent transfer to a duty station outside of Michigan. If the transfer is unaccompanied or a remote assignment with no dependents authorized, the military spouse may continue to practice law in Michigan until the service member is subsequently assigned to a duty station where dependents are authorized. The military spouse shall notify the Board when that subsequent assignment occurs.

The Military Spouse attorney must provide written notice to the Board of Law Examiners within 180 days if the death or disability of the service member creates the event in 1 or 2 above.

⁴ Pursuant to MCL 600.946 and Rule 5(A)(4), an applicant for admission to the bar without examination must intend in good faith to either practice actively in this state, or to engage in the teaching of law as a full-time instructor in a reputable and qualified law school duly incorporated under the laws of this state.
