ORDER TO REMIT PRISONER FUNDS FOR FINES, COSTS, AND ASSESSMENTS

PROCEDURAL STEPS TO TAKE WHEN DRAFTING THE ORDER

For defendants sentenced to prison by your court.

- 1. Upon sentencing, a Judgment of Sentence, Commitment to Department of Corrections (Form CC219b) is prepared and signed by the judge. An Order to Remit Prisoner Funds for Fines, Costs, and Assessments (Form MC 288) is also prepared and signed by the judge.
- 2. Complete the defendant's name, SID (State ID number), and date of birth on the MC 288 form. You do not have to fill in the institution name and address.
- 3. The balance owed should include all financial sanctions ordered by the court, **excluding** restitution.
- 4. The original judgment of sentence and order to remit prisoner funds are filed in the court file, and two (2) copies are certified and sent with the DOC paperwork so that one packet is sent with the defendant to the correctional facility.

For defendants not sentenced to prison by your court.

- 1. Complete the order to remit prisoner funds in its entirety. You will need to look up the facility where the defendant is being housed and the prisoner number on OTIS.
- 2. Once the form has been completed, and signed by the judge, you will need to complete the Certificate of Mailing. Be sure to make two additional copies. If you forget how many copies to make, this information is located at the upper right hand corner of the order. The original should be kept in the defendant's court file and a copy should be sent to the correctional institution and the defendant under separate cover. Certified mail is not necessary, but may be recommended for confirmation that the order has been received. If restitution is owed, a copy of the judgment of sentence should be included with the MC 288 form.

PROCEDURAL STEPS TO TAKE AFTER AN ORDER HAS BEEN SATISFIED

- 1. Upon full payment of the court-ordered financial obligations, including restitution, it is your responsibility to complete the Satisfaction of Financial Obligation (Form MC 290). This form does <u>not</u> need to be signed by the judge. The Certificate of Mailing should be signed and two additional copies should be made. The original goes in the file, and a copy is mailed to both the correctional institution and the defendant.
- 2. CONGRATULATIONS!!!!! You may now close your file.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

What is an Order to Remit Prisoner Funds for Fines, Costs, and Assessments?

It is an order that is signed by the presiding judge in order to have money withheld from a prisoner commissary account. It may also be referred to as a "prison sweep."

How often does this order need to be done?

You only need to complete the order once. If the prisoner is transferred to another facility, that facility will pick up the enforcement of the order.

How often is money withheld?

Per the order, the Michigan Department of Corrections (MDOC) can withhold 50% of any money received by the defendant over \$50 each month. For example, Johnny's mom puts \$200 in his account at her last visit. If there is an order to remit on Johnny's case, the MDOC can now sweep the account and withhold \$75 from this account. \$200 was deposited, minus the \$50 that is allowed by MDOC. That leaves a remainder of \$150. 50% of this amount would be \$75 that would be withheld for the court. Typically, the funds are held and not disbursed to the court until such time as \$100 or more is collected by MDOC.

Can this order be used for district court fines and costs as well?

Yes. This form can be used by the circuit court, including the family division, and the district court to collect on fines, costs, and assessments.

Will I be able to collect restitution by using this order?

No. The collection of restitution is governed by MCL 791.220h. It is collected separately by MDOC, based upon the restitution amount reflected on the judgment of sentence that is sent with the order to remit prisoner funds. An order to collect restitution will take priority over an order to remit prisoner funds.

Is there a fee involved to submit this order to the Michigan Department of Corrections?

No.
