On April 6, 2022, the Court heard oral argument on the application for leave to appeal the April 8, 2021 judgment of the Court of Appeals. We DIRECT the parties to file supplemental briefs within 21 days of the date of this order addressing: (1) whether MCL 769.1k(1)(b)(iii) violates separation of powers by assigning the judicial branch " 'tasks that are more properly accomplished by [the Legislature],' " Mistretta v United States, 488 US 361, 383 (1989), quoting Morrison v Olson, 487 US 654, 680-681 (1988); see also Houseman v Kent Circuit Judge, 58 Mich 364, 367 (1885); (2) whether MCL 769.1k(1)(b)(iii) violates due process by creating a "'potential for bias'" or an "objective risk of actual bias," Caperton v A T Massey Coal Co, Inc, 556 US 868, 881, 886 (2009), quoting Mayberry v Pennsylvania, 400 US 455, 465-466 (1971); see also, e.g., Williams v Pennsylvania, 579 US 1, 8-9 (2016); and (3) should we find MCL 769.1k(1)(b)(iii) facially unconstitutional under either theory, what remedy follows.

The application for leave to appeal remains pending.
